When they heard about our plan to go to Texas, they urged us not to make the long drive and instead invited us to stay with them on the Navajo reservation. Not only did this spare us hours of travel, but God also opened up opportunities for meetings on the reservation, and we gained a new supporting church!

To make it even better, we discovered that this missionary family, the M\_\_\_s, was also scheduled to attend our next Missions Conference in New Mexico. God orchestrated every step, and we are so thankful for the M\_\_\_s' friendship and hospitality. Praise the Lord for how He takes care of His servants!

Another huge answer to prayer is that my paperwork for the digital nomad visa was approved! This means when we arrive in Turkey by next April, we should be able to stay in the country long-term without interruption. In the meantime, our focus is on raising funds for the building project in Turkey. Not only did he do well, but he's already volunteered to preach again! God greatly moved his heart during our time on the Navajo reservation, and he is now praying about becoming a missionary to the Navajo people.
