This decision prompted him to begin meeting with me one on one every Saturday for a Bible-study curriculum, in addition to his faithful attendance on Sunday and Wednesdays, to aid in his discipleship. This is a curriculum I am currently developing that is specifically tailored for someone with zero former background in Christianity to give them a firm Biblical foundation of understanding in what they have placed or are considering placing their faith in.
